Course Content

This introductory course is designed to provide you with an overview of the legal system, legal concepts and legal institutions. Using a variety of interactive training methods, the course will introduce and explain the critical components of the legal system:

Parliament, courts, executive government and the rule of law

Sources of Law

- Common Law, Statute law and subordinate legislation
- State, Federal and International Law

Structure and classification of the law

- Private and public law
- Substantive and procedural law

Legal Concepts

- Precedent, jurisprudence, judgements

Where to find decisions and legislation?

- Reported and Unreported Cases
- Legislation and subordinate legislation

Learning Outcomes

The course will provide you with a basic understanding of the legal system, its vocabulary, institutions and structure. It will assist you to better understand the legal framework and identify gaps in your own knowledge and understanding so that you can better meet the needs of your clients.
